# 2008 Legislative Session FHNR Forum Bill Report # 10 2007-2008 Biennial Sessions Summary (April 6, 2008)

Thursday March 13<sup>th</sup> was the final day of legislative session 2008 (sine die). The final bill passed in 2008 tracked by this report was signed on Tuesday April 1<sup>st</sup>. Over the course of the 2007-2008 biennial sessions a total of 368 bills, resolutions and gubernatorial appointments of interest to the FHNR Forum report were introduced (about 7.2% of all of the legislation before the legislature in 2007 and 2008). Of these 79 measures were enacted including two appointments to the Fish & Wildlife Commission. The final FHNR Forum report for the 2007-2008 biennial sessions merges both 2007 and 2008 data into a single common format profiled first by tracking area and then in ranked order of introduction, by House of origin, within each tracking category.

Table one (below) summarizes the total legislative measures introduced, by type of legislation, over the course of the 2007-2008 biennial sessions. Both the House and Senate had nearly the same number of measures before them for consideration in 2007-2008 (2,561 in the House and 2,577 in the Senate. The House introduced 431 more bills than the Senate over the two years reviewed by this report. Bills highlighted in blue are enacted legislation from 2007 and 2008.

# Report Card

Every piece of legislation introduced is important to someone and in most cases unimportant to most people. Having said that, a wise person once commented that making law is like making sausage - a lot of ingredients go into the mix and the problem is making sure that what comes out at the end of the process is palatable. Not an easy task since the legislative process is a complex and never ending dance of competing opinions overlaid with political nuance influenced by egos, constitutional limitations and adjudicated law, financial constraints, personal belief systems versus science, campaign positioning -- the list of influences marches on to the horizon.

It can be legitimately argued that a major "hallmark" of the 2007-2008 biennial sessions is a high degree of avoidance in dealing with the most contentious natural resources issues. Depending on personal political beliefs that's either a good thing or a bad thing. From the perspective of the organizations providing the resources that make the FHNR Forum legislative report possible the legislature receives passing grades in most of the legislative categories monitored except that natural resources and enforcement funding remains inadequate. The legislature again receives a failing grade for avoiding the "tough" issues; most notably in the trapping, wolf reintroduction and wildlife damage arenas. The hindrance in resolving the trapping issue is the House Democratic Caucus and the Senate took no final action on the multiple wildlife damage bills passed by the House in 2007 and 2008. Table 2 (below) summarizes legislative action by tracked category for the 2007-2008 biennial sessions followed by individual category legislation detail.

Section 3181, page 143 and 144 (Wiley Slough Restoration) would have prohibited WDFW from expending funds for further work on the project until a report documenting the loss of recreational opportunity (duck hunting) was vetoed. The veto message stipulated that the Wiley Slough project has wide support and directed that WDFW work with duck hunters to mitigate the impacts of the project.

Section 307, Sub-Section 30, page 136 prohibiting WDFW from using appropriated funds to enforce the anti-trapping law against mole trapping and the trapping of mountain beaver from forest lands. The veto message stipulated that the section was vetoed as the budget is not the appropriate vehicle for making substantive policy changes in the manner and form that I-713 is implemented by the state.

Section 3028(5), page 68, Recreation and Conservation Funding Board, High Speed Watercraft Report: the proviso directed the Recreation and Conservation Funding Board to research hazards to the public from personal high-speed watercraft, such as jet skis, and to prepare a report with recommendations for increasing public enjoyment and safety when personal high-speed watercraft and other forms of motorized and non-motorized water recreation take place together. Because funding for this research was not provided the section was vetoed.

Section 3040, pages 75-76, Department of Natural Resources, Recreation Capital Renovations: the proviso would – with a number of exceptions – prohibit the Department of Natural Resources from constructing or expanding facilities or trails for off-road recreation vehicles on state land until after June 30, 2009. The section was vetoed because the Department of Natural Resources' planning process includes public input and considers all users and uses for recreation on state-managed lands.
